Many of you have seen me around the Post as I have come up through the ranks, and I present a short message.



Locally, in Chapel Hill, I have served as Post 6 Memorial Brick Sales Manager, six years; Post 6 Sergeant-at-Arms, four years; Post 6 Facilities Manager, four years; and Post 6 3rd Vice Commander two years. It was my honor and privilege to help bring our new post home to realization as a member of the Post 6 New Post Home Construction Committee—a six-year journey.

Local honors include service on the [Orange County Veterans Memorial](#) Committee for five years where we built the only community-funded veterans memorial in Orange County. I was honored by Orange County as a member of the Seymour Center Veterans' Wall of Honor, three years; and have had the distinct honor and privilege, extended to me by Immediate Past Post Commander Bill Munsee, of raising Old Glory for the first time at our new American Legion Post Home.

I serve the American Legion, Department of North Carolina, American Legion, as a Sergeant-at-Arms, three years, and was promoted to Chief Sergeant-at-Arms by Department Commander Mike Donnelly this year. Additionally, I was selected American Legionnaire of the Year, Department of North Carolina, for 2021.

The American Legion of our Fathers wasn't just envisioned as a monthly social gathering, but a hubbub of activity for Veterans, their families, and the community. The



American Legion is one of the few organizations left that still proudly recites the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of our great Union.
