## Ceremonial Flag Disposal

According to the U.S. Flag Code, when a flag is no longer in a condition that makes it a fitting emblem for display, it should be retired and destroyed in a dignified manner, preferably by burning.


American Legion posts around the country provide their communities with this service for respectful disposal of badly worn American flags, frequently performing this service each year on Flag Day.

Sons of American Legion, Post 6 recently performed this service on June 14th with a ceremonial burning of flags that have been deposited by a grateful public. While the exact ceremony can differ according to specific circumstances, an example of the ritual is described by an article from US History.org. After preparing an appropriate fire pit:

1. The color guard opens up the traditional trig-corner fold and refolds the flag in a coffin-shaped rectangle.
2. Participants assemble around the fire
3. All briskly salute
4. While still at attention, the leader conducts a respectful memorial service followed by the "Pledge of Allegiance" and a solemn silence.
5. When the flag is fully consumed, the celebrants other than the leader and color guard file out in a silent single file.
6. The leader and the color guard remain until the flag has been completely consumed.
7. Last, the fire should then be safely extinguished and the ashes buried.
